Shrubs Seedlings (3-25' Mature)

Black Chokeberry	\$2.00		Attractive white flowers, glossy foliage, and black berries. Excellent fall color.
Buffaloberry	\$2.00		Native, drought tolerant with silvery leaves. Good for jelly and wildlife.
Caragana	\$2.00		Drought tolerant, long lived with fine yellow flowers with non-edible pods.
Chokecherry	\$2.00		Native. White flowers in late April, fruits used in jams. Excellent for wildlife.
Schubert Chokecherry	\$2.00		Native. Reddish-purple foliage, same characteristic as chokecherry.
Redstemmed Dogwood	\$2.00		Native. Red stems provide good winter color, can tolerate wetter soils.
Elderberry	\$2.00		White flowers with dark berries when ripe. Good for jelly and wildlife
False Indigo	\$2.00		Native. Fast growing with purple flowers. Prefers moist soils.
Highbush Cranberry	\$2.00		Native. White flowers, red fruit that can be used for jelly, excellent fall color.
Common Lilac	\$2.00		Dense, suckering growth, fragrant white and purple flowers.
White Lilac	\$2.00		Same as common lilac with white flowers.
Villosa Lilac	\$2.00		Will not sucker. Rosy-lilac to white flowers, blooms later than common lilac.
Mongolian Cherry	\$2.00		Glossy leaves. White flowers and tart red fruit good for making jelly.
Nanking Cherry	\$2.00		Showy flowers, sweet red fruit good for jelly and wildlife.
Plum	\$2.00		Native, White flowers, edible fruit, good for jelly and wildlife.
Prairie Red Plum	\$2.00		Similar to American Plum with better fruit quality and size, up to 1.25 in.
Sandbar Willow	\$2.00		Native. Suckers quickly to form hedge. Needs moist soils, doesn't tolerate sod.
Sand Cherry	\$2.00		Native. White flowers in spring, purple fruit in summer that is good for jelly.
Seaberry	\$2.00		Tolerates drought high pH, and saline soils. Needs well drained soils. Thorns.
Silverberry	\$2.00		Native. Silver leaves. Tolerates drought, high pH and saline soils.
Smooth Sumac	\$2.00		Native. Great red fall color. Dark red seedheads. Moderate drought tolerance.
Nannyberry Viburnum	\$2.00		Native. Shiny leaves, white flowers, and excellent fall colors.

Medium Trees Seedlings (15-30' Mature)

Apricot	\$2.00		Pink flowers subject to frost. May produce edible fruit 2 out of 5 years.
Amur Chokecherry	\$2.00		Showy white flowers, black fruit, attractive copper-color bark, very cold hardy.
Pin Cherry	\$2.00		Native. White flowers, red fruit. Leaves and twigs poisonous to humans & livestock.
Midwest Crab	\$2.00		Showy white flowers, small red resistant fruit. Excellent for wildlife.
Red Splendar Crab	\$2.00		Flowers are pink or white. Foliage green to red in color, excellent for wildlife.
Harbin Pear	\$2.00		Hardy, slow growing tree, does well in wetter soils.
Tatrian Maple	\$2.00		Similar to Amur Maple, better alkaline soils tolerance, yellow, pink, or red fall color.
Amur Maple	\$2.00		Brilliant red fall color. Usually forms several trunks.
Mullberry	\$2.00		Fast growing, edible pink, purple or black fruit attracts birds. Drought tolerant.
Russian Olive	\$2.00		Grayish green leaves, fragrant flowers, fruit good for wildlife. Drought tolerant.
Laurel Leaf Willow	\$2.00		Wide glossy leaves, does well in wetter soils.

Tall Trees Seedlings (25'+ Mature)

Quaking Aspen	\$2.00		Native. Fast growing, cold tolerant, leaves flutter in the breeze.
Black Cherry	\$2.00		Native. Dark fruit, white flowers. Leaves and twigs poisonous to humans and livestock.
Black Walnut	\$2.00		Native. Valuable wood, edible nuts that attracts wildlife.
Boxelder	\$2.00		Native. Flood plain tree does well in moist upland soils. Intolerant of 2,4D drift.
Bur Oak	\$2.00		Native. Extremely tough, drought tolerant, long lived. Acorns for wildlife.

Catalpa	\$2.00		Native. Huge leaves, beautiful white flowers, produces long pods.
Hybrid Cottonwood	\$2.00		Fast growing shade tree that has no cotton. Short lived.
4-5' Hybrid Cottonwood	\$10.00		
Native Cottonwood	\$2.00		Fast growing shade tree that produces cotton.
4-5' Native Cottonwood	\$10.00		
Green Ash	\$2.00		Native, high pH and drought tolerance. Emerald Ash Borer is a threat.
Golden Willow	\$2.00		Narrow leaves, yellow to reddish twigs, tolerate of moist soils, fast growing.
Hackberry	\$2.00		Native. Good shade tree, drought tolerant and very long lived and adaptable.
4-5' Hackberry	\$10.00		
Honeylocust	\$2.00		Native. Fine lacy looking leaves, long brown pods. Tough and adaptable.

Kentucky Coffee Tree	\$2.00		Native. Coarse branches. Produces flat pods with hard round seeds.
American Linden	\$2.00		Native. Attractive fragrant white flowers in June.
4-5' American Linden	\$10.00		
Little Leaf Linden	\$2.00		Same as American Linden except for pyramidal growth.

Freeman Maple	\$2.00		Naturally occurring hybrid of Silver & Red Maple. Fast growing & good fall color.
4-5' Freeman Maple	\$10.00		
Sliver Maple	\$2.00		Native. Fast growing, yellow fall color.

***Tree tubes work great for medium and tall trees. They will protect them from deer and help them grow faster and stronger.**

Conifers Seedlings (Evergreens 40-60' Mature)

Eastern Red Cedar	\$2.25		Native. Drought tolerant, reddish brown to purple in winter. Good for wildlife.
Rocky Mountain Juniper	\$2.25		Silver blue prickly needles, very hardy.
Black Hills Spruce	\$2.25		Native. Soft rounded needles, dense, state tree of South Dakota.
Meyer Spruce	\$2.50		Similar to Colorado Spruce, more tolerant of drought, less insect/disease troubles.
Norway Spruce	\$2.25		Green needles, large cones, ascending branches.
Austrian Pine	\$2.25		Medium length needles, shiny dark green, silvery white bud, slowing growing.
Ponderosa Pine	\$2.25		Long needles, native to the Black Hills, fast growing once established.
Scotch Pine	\$2.25		Short blue green needles, prefers sandy to loam soils.
